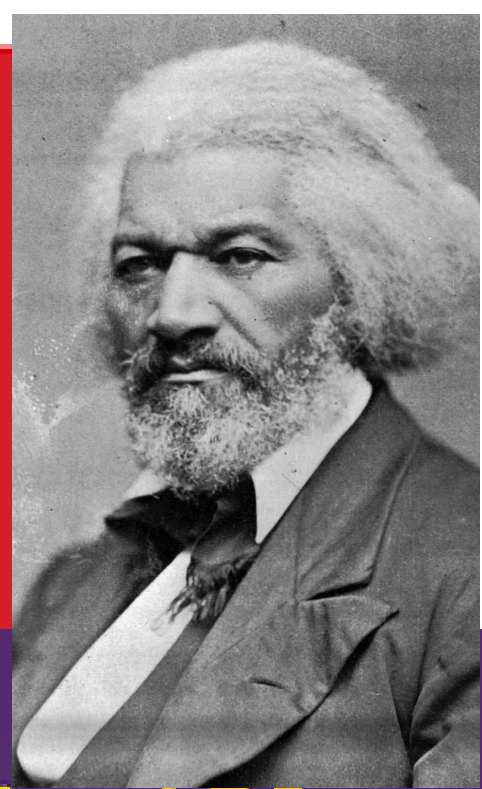

- **HENDERSON HIGH SCHOOL: OUT OF 1,296 STUDENTS, 63 ARE BLACK, 1016 ARE WHITE, 153 ARE FREE LUNCH ELIGIBLE, THE GRADUATION RATE IS 96%, AND THE COLLEGE READINESS INDEX IS 42.1.**
- **DOWNINGTOWN EAST HIGH SCHOOL: OUT OF 1,749 STUDENTS, 53 ARE BLACK, 1355 ARE WHITE, 150 ARE FREE LUNCH ELIGIBLE, THE GRADUATION RATE IS 97% (UP 3% IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS), AND THE COLLEGE READINESS INDEX IS 61.3**
- **COATESVILLE AREA HIGH SCHOOL: OUT OF 910 STUDENTS, 299 ARE BLACK, 423 ARE WHITE, 295 ARE FREE LUNCH ELIGIBLE (ALMOST TWICE AS MANY AS THE OTHER TWO SCHOOLS), THE GRADUATION RATE IS 84% (DOWN 3% IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS), AND THE COLLEGE READINESS INDEX IS 11.6...YES, THAT'S ELEVEN POINT SIX.**

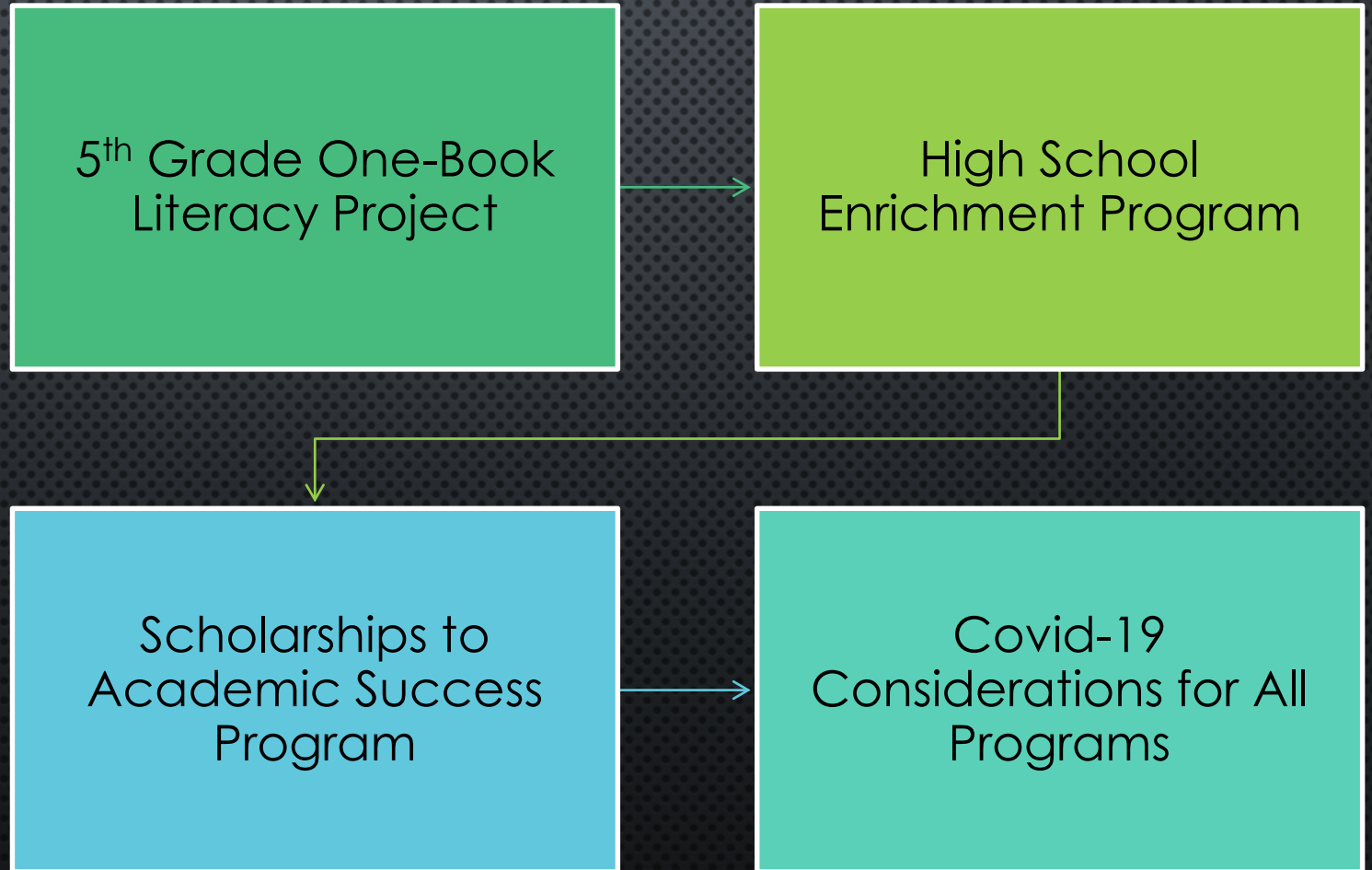

- THE CURRENT BOOK IS "WHO WERE THE TUSKEGEE AIRMEN?,"
- THE BOOK INTRODUCES STUDENTS TO CONCEPTS OF SOCIAL JUSTICE, FAIRNESS AND THE IMPORTANCE OF LITERACY THROUGH GUIDED READING AND COMPREHENSIVE EXERCISES.

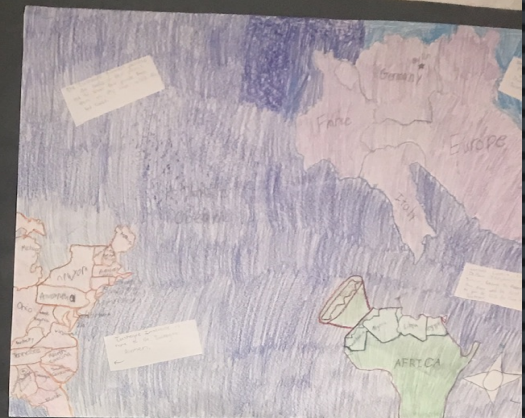
The Map of WW2

Chapter 1 "Two Americas"

World War II had broken out in Europe. In May 1939, two black men named Chauncey and Dale Spencer flew an old airplane from Chicago to Washington D.C. They wanted to encourage other black people to become pilots.

The Tuskegee Institute was a famous black college founded by Booker T. Washington in 1868. The first part of learning to fly is ground school. Students learn how to read weather and a lot more stuff.

Chapter 3 "We Need More Men"

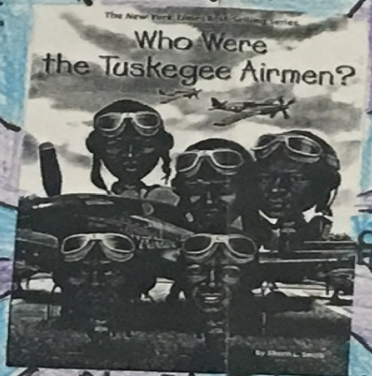

Benjamin O. Davis Jr. had a father who was a pilot in the U.S. Army Airforce. He was the first black pilot in the U.S. Army Airforce. His father was the first black man to walk miles carrying all their gear!

On October 19, 1945 the 100th FG was also shut down. The Tuskegee Experiment was at an end.

When it came to guessing if certain people were German spies, whites could trust blacks.

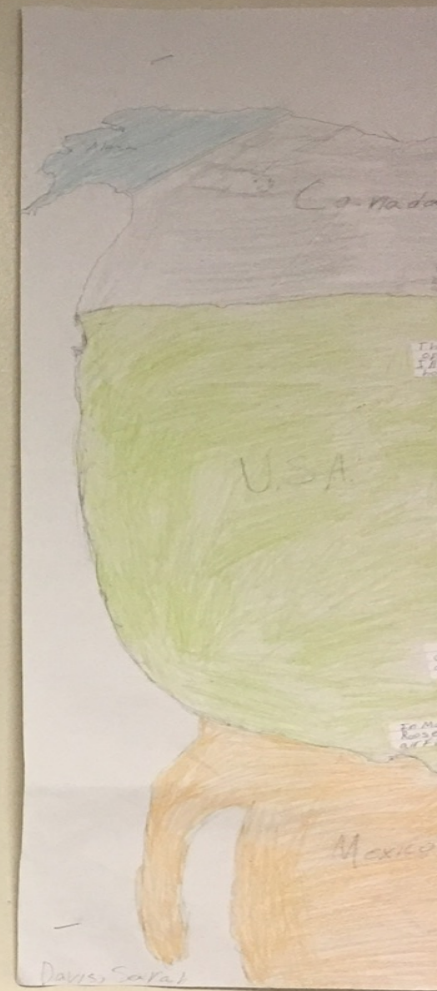
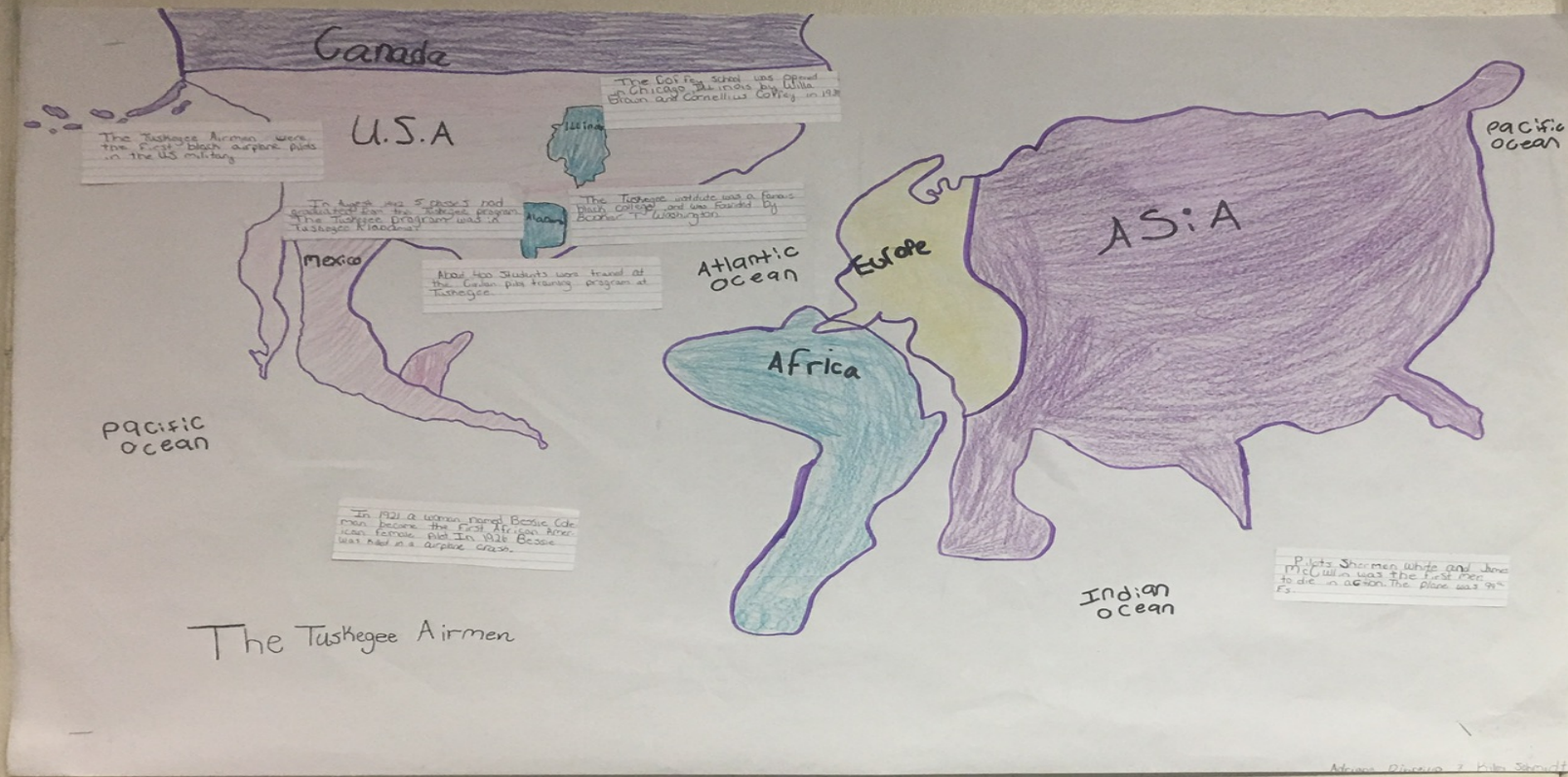

At age 13, Chauncey Coffey flew a plane. Later, Coffey and Willie Brown opened a pilot training school.

Chauncey Spencer and Dale White flew to Washington, DC. The two wanted to encourage other African Americans to become pilots.

The first black pilot accepted into the US Army Air Corps.

The first black pilot took down an enemy plane.

The Tuskegee Army Airfield closed permanently.

The airport land was given to the city. The airport is still open today.

The two original hangars are now part of the Tuskegee Army National Historic Site Museum.

- SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS ARE AMBASSADORS FOR THE WELLS FARGO - FDI ACADEMY AND HELP WITH RECRUITMENT OF STUDENTS FROM COATESVILLE TO WCU AND OTHER COLLEGES.
- THE AWARD WINNERS WILL BE MENTORED THROUGHOUT THEIR ACADEMIC PROGRAM AT WCU. THE WELLS FARGO SCHOLARSHIPS WOULD COVER THE TOTAL COST OF THE ASP SUMMER SESSION FOR THE SUMMER 2021 TERM.
- IN ADDITION, FUNDS FROM THE GRANT HELP FILL CRITICAL TECHNOLOGY GAPS, INCLUDING THE PURCHASE OF LAPTOPS AND HOTSPOTS, FOR SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS.
