

## STANDARDS FOR THE USE OF MICROWAVE OVENS

## Purpose

To provide minimum standards for safe microwave operation in order to allow employees and students to retain the privilege of having a personal microwave appliance in their residence room or office area.

## General

A microwave oven is designed to cook, reheat or defrost foods in a relatively short time. Used responsibly according to manufacturer's operating instructions, microwave ovens rarely cause any fire safety concerns. However, when used in a careless manner, snack foods such as popcorn, noodles, pizza, etc., often are overcooked and will start to burn, setting off building smoke alarms.

## Policy

The following minimum standards must be met in order for a microwave to be used in a residential room or office area.

- 1. Microwave oven power output must be limited to 1000 watts or less.
- 2. The unit must be UL approved.
- 3. Microwave ovens must be plugged directly into a grounded power outlet. Extension cords are not permitted for use with microwaves under any circumstance.
- 4. No more than one microwave oven will be allowed per room.
  - a. For office areas on campus, if a common break room is available placing a microwave in that space that meets the criteria contained within this Standard is permitted. For office areas that do not have a common break room available, a microwave can be allowed in an individual office space but will require the approval of the Facility Administrator.
  - b. For residential areas, in addition to the standards noted here students must also follow the standards as outlined in the Guide to Residential Living.
- 5. A microwave with a UL/CSA tested/listed anti-smoke/anti-fire sensing device installed to detect emissions from microwave venting system is preferred.
