

2025-26 WCU 1871 Award Application

Established in 2018, the 1871 Award annually recognizes up to 71 West Chester University juniors and seniors who are high-achieving in academics, leadership, community engagement and career readiness. Applicants must be undergraduate students who have completed a minimum of 60 credits (at least 30 must have been earned at WCU) and are in good conduct standing. By submitting this application, you are consenting to have your academic and conduct records reviewed by a member of the selection committee.

Applicants will be reviewed on the following criteria: Academics (25%); Leadership (25%); Community Engagement (25%) and Career Readiness (25%). You are encouraged to review the selection rubric to familiarize yourself with the details of the evaluation criteria.

The application consists of four sections: 1) Student personal information; 2) Short answer questions; 3) Resume or curriculum vitae; 4) Letters of recommendation. It is recommended that applicants draft their responses to the short answer questions in a Word document and then paste those responses into the relevant fields. Please note that your recommenders should submit their letters to you and you submit them via this form. We cannot accept them separately via email.

The deadline to apply is Monday, November 3, 2025 at noon. Applicants will be notified of their status in January 2026, and those selected will be honored at an awards ceremony on Thursday, March 26, 2026.
