STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

Overall student engagement rose a modest 1% over last year in terms of the amount of engagement, but a much higher increase compared to just three years ago (31% increase from FY22). The unique number of students engaged increased as well - 2% over last year and 26% compared to three years ago. These gains were possible through the growing of partnerships with our signature events, as well as our collaborations with faculty in the classroom. As the TCDC continues to strive for 100% engagement, meaningful on and off campus partnerships will be critical.



EMPLOYER & EXTERNAL ENGAGEMENT

Employer engagement held steady this year, increasing 9% over the last year. On top of those gains, the TCDC created some new ways for employers to engage with the campus in meaningful ways, including the Employer Appreciation Breakfast and the return of the Employer Advisory Board. Based on survey data, we know that employers keep coming back to WCU because of the talent they meet, their level of preparedness, and the way their skills and academic preparation align with their hiring needs.

Employer Appreciation

Over 60 employers came back to campus in May 2025 so that we could celebrate another successful year of hiring at WCU, and to show appreciation for the individuals who give their time, energy, and resources to hiring WCU students for full time and internship roles. During the event, a panel of students highlighted their experiential learning opportunities.

Employer Advisory Board

The Employer Advisory Board is comprised of 11 employers who regularly recruit at WCU and are committed to strengthening the TCDC's impact through student-employer connections. The Board convened in May 2025, and included BDO, Diamond State Financial, Elwyn, Enterprise Mobility, Frontage Labs, Main Line Health, PwC, SEI, The Judge Group, Vanguard, and YMCA of Greater Brandywine.

Chamber & Other External Engagement

The TCDC partnered with several local Chambers of Commerce, most notably with the Greater West Chester Chamber and Downtown West Chester to host a Part Time Job Fair, and the Chester County Chamber to do a drive for the Career Closet. The TCDC also hosted the West Chester Rotary Sunshine Club on campus, and partnered with PA Career Link and Chester County Community Development to host a county-wide job fair in April 2025.
