

## Hollywood Square

### Game Template Instructions

#### When to use Hollywood Square in the Classroom

Integrating Hollywood Squares into a class-period is a type of Game-based learning. You can use this game template for most disciplines to review a series of terms, questions, procedures and more. The game is excellent for reviewing material and can build student motivation and enthusiasm.

#### How to play Instructional Hollywood Squares

**1. Getting Started**

Divide your class into two teams. Team X and Team Z. Once you start the game, you will need to click through the introduction of characters until you reach the slide with all characters.

**2. Answering Questions**

Flip a coin to determine which team goes first. The team picks a square and the instructor clicks on the character in that square to see their question. For review have the team state/guess their answer before revealing the character's answer. Click "Answer" to see the answer given by that character. The team must agree or disagree with the answer the character has given.

**3. Earning Points**




If the team is correct, they will get the square. If the team is wrong, their opponent will get the square. Click on the home button on the slide with the character answer to return the slide with all characters on it ("Home"). Click the light purple "X" or "Z" in the gold box to highlight the team that won that square.


**4. Winning the Game**




To win, the team either gets three in a row (across, vertical or diagonal) or has 5 squares. Calculate who won and click "End the Game" when you have revealed and answered all questions.

## How to edit the Template

1. Before editing any content begin the Presentation slide show from the beginning and navigate through the slides in order to see how things appear initially. When you are playing you will be clicking on specific items to reveal new content or returned to previous slides.
  - a. You can also watch the navigation video to see what is clickable and how the game will look later.

### How to edit the Characters?

Step	Slide Screenshot
1. Select all Character images and delete them.	

	
<p>2. Drag and drop new character images in appropriate squares. Adjust size when needed.</p>	
<p>3. Click on “Animations” in the top PowerPoint edit menu bar.</p>	

4. Click “Animation Pane” to reveal the side animations panel menu (listing all existing animations).




5. Select the character name text box.




6. Click “Appear” in the green star animation options near the top left corner.



7. Click “Triggers” to reveal the drop-down menu on the right side on the screen.



8. Select the “on click” option.



9. Select the drop-down menu immediately to the right of “on click” and click the new character image number to select that image as this animations trigger.

- If you cannot determine which item is the character image, select the image and add an animation to it to know what image number it is (it will display in the animation panel on the right. Delete this animation once you know what number object it is.).
- This means when the character image is click during the presentation it will make the character’s name appear.
